A glance back at 2010 and a look forward to 2011



I can't believe another year has passed. We had a good year. We learned a lot in Spanish School, on the field in Haiti, & on the field in Honduras. We are excited about the upcoming year. We have 5 main goals for the year.

1. Water well for the Hospital & Garden project. Greater Works Ministry from Dallas Texas is partnering with us to drill a well behind the hospital in La Esperanza. This well will provide clean water for the hospital & for the high risk pregnant women who stay behind the hospital for the last 3 weeks of their pregnancy as well as provide clean irrigation water for our garden pro-



ject. Most of you know that we have been trying to grow a garden for those high risk pregnant women so that they not only have food to eat while staying there, but to teach them nutrition, gardening, & hygiene while incorporating Godly living so that they can take vegetable seeds & seeds of the WORD to their homes and villages and teach these principles.

2. A Women's Conference in September 2011 for the women of La Esperanza & Yamaranguila. This conference will highlight a team of women who have testimonies of loss, abuse, poverty, & desperation whom God has delivered. The theme behind the conference is to allow the women to hear the gospel & to receive the hope, grace, mercy & salvation that comes from it as well as to honor the women of Honduras and show them that God created them, that He knows every hair on their head, that they are special, they were planned, they do have purpose.
3. Dean will be teaching the Honduran missionary interns the Biblical Foundations, Perspectives, and other missionary training courses. This is part of the Missionary Training Program of Mercy International.
4. Dean will also be working on the gardening project & incorporating the Heifer project to the mountains. Our project is called Sustainable Healthy Living. Our plan is to implement the programs, teach them, & allow the local Hondurans to continue the project.
5. I will also be continuing with medical clinics, small groups, and working with the hospital to continue to get the ceiling fixed & equipping it with proper medical equipment & supplies. We are raising funds to buy a vehicle for a mobile clinic.
6. We have the opportunity to obtain \$250,000 worth of new medical equipment for \$12,000 complete with shipping. We are praying for the funding for this.
7. We are also praying for a house for us & possibly starting to grow macadamia nut trees to provide work for many Hondurans & provide an excellent source of vitamins & protein to the Hondurans.
